Alaska Health Mandate 10 Self-Quarantine Requirements

As part of Eni's state approved Protective Period Plan (PPP), workers may travel to Alaska and self-quarantine for 14 days at Eni operated facilities on the North Slope. During the self-quarantine protective period, workers (restricted residents) must adhere to the following requirements.

Supervisors of Restricted Residents	Supervisors will notify Security that employee is a restricted resident prior to each hitch . A Document will be placed in the room providing detailed requirements of the PPP. This will include a unique door tag to be hung by restricted residents on their room doors for the duration of the 14-day protective period.	
Restricted Residents	<p>Restricted residents are to remain in their room when not at work and are prohibited from using common use areas such as exercise facilities and dining hall sit down seating. Face coverings are to be worn at all times outside of rooms or offices.</p> <p>Gloves must be worn at all times outside your room and your own office or personal workspace where you will touch something others may touch after you. Gloves are not required for handrails and doorknobs if hand sanitizer is available and use <u>before</u> touching them.</p>	
Housekeeping of Rooms	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Restricted residents are responsible for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ cleaning their room with provided sanitation products ◦ emptying trash receptacles ◦ changing linens/towels • Housekeeping will not enter during the 14-day protective period. 	
Bathrooms/Showers	Suite Bathroom/Shower <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Restricted residents must sanitize all surfaces of contact (toilets, sinks, showers, door handles) after each use. • Housekeeping will enter through non-restricted resident room and clean every other day. (No change from current practice.) 	Common Bathrooms/Showers <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Restricted residents must sanitize all surfaces of contact (toilets, sinks, showers, door handles) after each use. • Housekeeping cleans and sanitizes daily (No change from current practice).
Temperature Log	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Restricted residents are responsible for monitoring body temperature twice daily and recording temperatures on a temperature log. • Restricted residents are encouraged to bring their own thermometer. • Acceptable thermometers include digital or laser that measure oral, skin, or ear temperature with a tolerance of +/- 0.5 degrees F. • Stick on/color change strip style thermometers are not acceptable. • Turn in temperature log at end of 14-day protective period to medical.
