

Eni Cycle Testing Strategy COVID-19 Mitigation Plan

All persons (vaccinated or non-vaccinated) on any of Eni’s sites, will be tested with an antigen test every 72 hours.
If a person arrives on a testing day their rapid molecular test at the airport of departure will count as their test for that day.
If a person arrives on a non-testing day, they will wait for the next antigen-testing day.
No testing will occur on a person’s go home day or the day before they go home, provided they are symptom free.
A person that is within 30 days of testing positive, that was asymptomatic, will not get tested by antigen unless symptoms develop. (Once the 30 days is up, those individuals will be back in the antigen testing pool.)
A person that is within 30 days of the onset of symptoms, that tested positive, will not be tested by antigen, unless symptoms develop (Once the 30 days is up, those individuals will be back in the antigen testing pool.)

Results	Symptoms	Actions
Molecular Positive	None	Isolate for 10 days from test date
Molecular Positive	Present	Isolate for 10 days from onset of symptoms
Antigen Positive	None	Confirm with molecular: if molecular positive isolate for 10 days, if negative release and report both to state (not considered a positive).
Antigen Positive	Present	No confirmatory test needed. Isolate for 10 days from symptom onset.
Molecular Negative	None	No actions needed
Molecular Negative	Present	Send PCR to lab, isolate, test for Flu A& B. Patient must isolate until symptom free for 24 hours if all tests negative.
Antigen Negative	None	No action needed
Antigen Negative	Present	Perform molecular test, isolate patient. Rapid molecular, if negative→Lab based PCR & Flu test→If all negative isolate until symptom free for 24 hours.

As we are using antigen tests on an asymptomatic population, we must follow the State of Alaska/CDC guidelines for antigen testing. Confirmatory testing will be the Abbott IDNOW rapid molecular test.
